



LEVEL 2 ADULT CARE WORKER APPRENTICESHIP

About the apprenticeship

This programme will develop the knowledge, skills and behaviours of adult care workers to make a positive difference to lives of the people they support. You will be working in a frontline role such as carer or support worker.

Undertaking this apprenticeship will enable the Adult Care Worker to develop their ability to help the people they support to choose and achieve their personal goals while maintaining independence and staying safe. The Adult Care Worker will develop skills and knowledge to promote the health and wellbeing of all the people they support, whilst ensuring compliance with legislation, policies and strategies at national, local and setting based level.

They will develop their values, skills and behaviours to deliver excellent support, demonstrating care and compassion.

The Adult Care Worker will be undertaking a rewarding, fulfilling and worthwhile role that could lead to excellent career progression within the industry.

Duration

With a duration of 15 months (including 3 months End Point Assessment), you will receive online training and face to face support from our assessor.

On starting you will undertake an online skills scan enabling us to understand your learning style and needs and we will tailor your learning experience accordingly. Your assessor will work with you to ensure that you stay on track to complete your programme on time by managing your progress through Bud our learning platform.

Off the Job-Training

Around 6 hours of your working week is spent in completing off the job training. This can be any time devoted to learning and improving new skills and can include:

Online teaching, practical training, writing assignments.

Entry requirements

You must have been a UK, EEA, or EU resident for at least the three years immediately before starting the apprenticeship. In addition, you must be employed in a relevant job role and able to commit to the full length of the programme including the End Point Assessment.

If you do not have GCSE grade C/4 or equivalent in Maths and English, you will be required to work towards achieving these qualifications as part of your apprenticeship.

End Point Assessment

The knowledge, skills, and behaviours that you have learned throughout your apprenticeship, and which confirms that you are occupationally competent will be assessed by an independent assessor. This will be through a combination of the following:-

Situational Judgement Test (Multiple Choice) and a Professional Discussion (supported by a portfolio).

What does it cost?

The cost of the programme is £4000 and is funded by the Government. Employers are required to make a co-investment payment of 5% (£200) towards this cost where they employ 50 or more people or employ an Apprentice aged 19 or over.
